



In July 1958, Dr. Jerome Lejeune became the first geneticist to discover a link between an intellectual disability and a chromosomal abnormality. He had a profound impact on the field of cytogenetics. In 1997, the Jerome Lejeune Institute opened, becoming the first specialized paramedical consultation center in Europe to provide medical care for patients with intellectual disabilities of genetic origin.

This year, we are working to bring the first medical center with **holistic care** for children and adults with Down syndrome to the United States, inclusive of geriatric care.

THE FACTS

Did you know that Down syndrome is the most common chromosomal condition in the country? One in 700 babies in the USA is born with it.

THE CHALLENGE

Individuals with Down syndrome often present signs and symptoms differently and can experience challenges finding medical care customized to their needs. Unfortunately, most medical professionals have little to no experience working with people with Down syndrome.

Additionally, the average medical costs for children with Down syndrome are **twelve times higher than for those without**. They have an increased risk of health problems such as heart defects, hearing loss, obstructive sleep apnea, ear infections, eye diseases, Alzheimer's disease, and more.

The Jerome Lejeune Foundation Medical Center

The goal is to launch the first medical center with **holistic care** for children and adults with Down syndrome to the United States, inclusive of geriatric care.

The Jerome Lejeune Foundation medical center will provide medical care for ultimately 100,000 patients annually.

THE NEED

Immediate:

- **\$600,000 between now and May 2020**

Needed to fund the cash flow requirement to open the medical center in order to start receiving patients in May. This includes clinician salaries, clinician knowledge transfer, and BioBank infrastructure.

After the center opens:

- **\$1.2 million per year**

Needed to fund the yearly medical center operating budget not funded by patient health insurance copays and reimbursements.

- Child and adolescent psychiatric services
- Diagnosis and therapy for sleep disorders
- Neuropsychological evaluation
- Pediatric behavioral and radiology services
- Speech therapy (pediatric language development and articulation)
